Convocation History

Universities are rich in tradition and ceremony, and nowhere is this more apparent than at convocation, when the university community comes together to celebrate new graduates.

Many early European universities originated within the church in the medieval period, and this is reflected in convocation's strong ecclesiastical connection. The chancellor presides over convocation and takes their title from the person who was head of the theological faculty of these early universities. As head of the chancery, the chancellor was responsible for examining students prior to their receiving degrees. Over the ages, the role of the chancellor has changed. Today, the Royal Roads chancellor, who also chairs the Board

of Governors, is the person empowered by the provincial government to confer degrees and oversee the direction of the university.

Universities have undergone dramatic changes over the past 900 years. Today, as universities break down barriers of background, income and geography to welcome lifelong students to education, the convocation ceremony reminds us of the strong traditions that reach back to the very different world of medieval learning. In the 21st century, lifelong students require universities to keep pace with changing times. Royal Roads University is proud to be a leader in this new generation.



The Coat of Arms of Royal Roads University



In 1997, we were honoured to be granted a coat of arms by the Governor General of Canada. The coat of arms presented to Royal Roads University incorporates symbols of the traditions that link the university to our past and to the province of British Columbia: the sun from the province's coat of arms, the three maple leaves from the crest of the former Royal Roads Military College, and the book of learning as a reference to the voyage of academic discovery. The shield is supported by a cougar, Indigenous to Vancouver Island, and Synqua, a dragon representing the Coast Salish creature of thunder, strength and power. The crown and the anchor held by the supports represent Royal Roads, the navy's anchorage off the Esquimalt Lagoon.

The motto of the university—Living Our Learning—captures the spirit and enthusiasm of our institution. Translated into Coast Salish, the motto recognizes the proud traditions of those who have come before us.

The Maces

The convocation ceremony typically begins with the arrival of two maces. The Royal Roads Military College mace is displayed in tribute to the history of the campus, and the Royal Roads University mace represents the history, academic direction and vision of the university.

The university's mace was a gift from its first graduating class, in 1997. The silver dome in the head of the mace represents the sun and the relationship of east and west. The stylized turret surrounding the dome indicates the historical significance of Hatley Castle and the former Royal Roads Military College. Three maple leaves crafted in oyster shell inset in alternating steps of the turret represent the Indigenous, French and English peoples of Canada.

Six crafted flutes surround the head of the mace. The silver band delineating the head and shaft is engraved with stylized images of water and balances the mace while effectively isolating the head from the main shaft, similar to the way Vancouver Island is isolated from the mainland.



President's Regalia

Enduring Commitment, New Traditions

Regalia traditions celebrating academic rites of passage date to the Middle Ages. The commitment to excellence and achievement endures as we accept the scholarship from mentors and teachers who came before us.

We also embrace a future where equity, diversity and inclusion are integral to all the ways in which we work, live and study.

Royal Roads University's new regalia signals that future. Located on the traditional Lands of the Xwsepsum and Lekwungen ancestors and families who have lived here for thousands of years, the university acknowledges the learning we undertake and still have ahead to co-create an inclusive world.

Master carver and Songhees Nation Elder Clarence "Butch" Dick (YUX'WEY'LUPTON) generously created the symbols that grace our new regalia. The Staqeya (Wolf) represents the Coast Salish People. It symbolizes the strength of family and kinship and embodies the power of teamwork and community effort. The Sneq'wa (Blue Heron) represents the ability to progress and evolve on a path of self-determination. Its elegance and innate wisdom allow it to manoeuvre through life with grace.



About the Artist

Dr. Clarence "Butch" Dick (Yux'wey'lupton) is among Victoria's most influential Coast Salish artists. His carvings and public art can be seen around the region, from the Ogden Point breakwater mural, to the *Signs of Lekwungen* interpretive walkway along Victoria's inner harbour, to the mural at Royal Roads University on Esquimalt Lagoon. Butch Dick has been an educator and a mentor to many, championing Indigenous youth empowerment and educational equity through more than two decades as a teacher with School District 61, four years as assistant professor in Indigenous teaching and learning at the University of Victoria and more than six years as education liaison for the Songhees Nation. He was instrumental in the launch of the Songhees Recreation and Wellness Centre in 2013 and the driving force behind the Indigenous Youth Showcase, which provides mentorship for youth to develop their own artistic vision, focus and career paths. He was inducted into the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts in 2013 and received the Victoria Leadership Lifetime Achievement Award in 2015. Butch Dick is a member of the Heron People Circle, trusted Old Ones/Elders and Traditional Knowledge Keepers and received an honorary doctorate from Royal Roads University in 2021.

Medals

An academic medal signifies academic achievement or honours exceptional qualities like leadership, personal growth, commitment to sustainability, and positive and proactive work in equity, diversity and inclusion. These are the kinds of qualities that support Royal Roads University's vision to inspire people with courage to transform the world.

Royal Roads University awards two medals in each of our degree programs—the Founders' Award for exemplifying personal qualities relevant to the program and the Chancellor's Award for highest academic achievement. Medals are awarded at the convocation ceremony that the majority of students from a program are expected to attend, whether spring or fall.

The medals are a high-quality, heavy silver medallion embossed with the university crest on one side and the university logo on the other, ringed with the name of the award. The ribbons align with the university's colour theme and are selected to help recipients stand out among their peers when dressed in regalia.

In addition to these medals, Royal Roads has the pleasure of awarding the Governor General's Gold medal for highest academic achievement in graduate studies, the Governor General's Silver medal for highest academic achievement in undergraduate studies, and the Lieutenant Governor's Medal for Inclusion, Democracy and Reconciliation.

Chancellor's Award

This medal recognizes one graduating student in each program per year for having achieved the highest academic performance.



Founders' Award

This medal recognizes one graduating student in each cohort who exemplifies personal qualities relevant to the program's field of study.

Honorary Degree Recipient

Jody Thomas

Jody Thomas was appointed National Security and Intelligence Advisor to the Prime Minister of Canada, effective January 11, 2022. As a dedicated public servant, Ms. Thomas leads with strength, care and conviction, tackling some of Canada's most sensitive security challenges.

Ms. Thomas is a person of exceptional merit who has made substantial contributions to Canada in her role as a public figure. She has dedicated more than 35 years to public service. In the past eight years, Ms. Thomas has served at the most senior levels of the federal government. Prior to being appointed as the NSIA, she served as the Deputy Minister of National Defence.

In 1984, Ms. Thomas joined the naval reserves as a diesel mechanic at age 17 and was among the first women to serve on a Canadian military vessel. Ms. Thomas began her career in the public service in 1988 when she was appointed Chief of Business Planning and Administration with Public Works and Government Services Canada's Atlantic Region. Ms. Thomas then moved to the West Coast as the Business Manager of the Esquimalt Graving Dock in Victoria, British Columbia. From 1995 to 2010, she joined Passport Canada, where she served as Manager of the Victoria Passport Office. This led to a number of senior roles within Passport Canada, culminating in Chief Operating Officer, where she managed service delivery at 35 locations involving 3,000 employees across Canada.

In 2010, Ms. Thomas joined the Canadian Coast Guard, where she held the position of Deputy Commissioner of Operations for four years, during which she provided leadership and functional direction in the development of the Coast Guard's strategic and operational policy frameworks. In September 2014, Ms. Thomas was appointed Special Advisor to the Deputy Secretary to the Cabinet (Operations) at the Privy Council Office until her appointment as Commissioner of the Coast Guard on January 1, 2015. On March 13, 2017, she joined the Department of National Defence, where she served as Senior Associate Deputy Minister. She was appointed Deputy Minister of National Defence on October 23, 2017, a role in which she served until January 10, 2022.

Ms. Thomas was instrumental in overhauling a culture of hiding sexual harassment and assault in the Canadian Armed Forces. As a woman navigating her way through the ranks in a male-dominated workforce, she did not shy away from challenging conversations. Ms. Thomas is a courageous and resolute advocate for mental health and equity, diversity and inclusion in the defence and security communities.

Ms. Thomas has been at the centre of some of the seminal domestic and international decisions in recent Canadian history, including Canada's security posture concerning the war in Ukraine; critical intelligence and counsel to the Prime Minister and Cabinet during the occupation in Ottawa that ultimately led to the invocation of the Emergencies Act; response by the Canadian Forces to BC wildfires, Fraser Valley flooding and the COVID-19 pandemic; concerns over Canada's sovereignty in the Arctic; and Canadians being held illegally by foreign governments.

At the same time as Ms. Thomas provides a point of authority on some of this nation's top security concerns, she is also a steadfast spouse, mother and friend.

Honorary Degree Recipient

Hayalthkin'game Carey Newman

Carey Newman, whose traditional name is Hayalthkin'game, is a multidisciplinary Indigenous artist, master carver, filmmaker, author and public speaker.

Through his father, he is Kwakwaka'wakw from the Kukwaka'm, Gixsam and Wawataba'yi clans of northern Vancouver Island, and Coast Salish from Xwchíyò:m (Cheam) of the Stó:lō S'olh Temexw (traditional territories) along the upper Fraser Valley. On his mother's side of the family, his ancestry comes from English, Irish and Scottish settlers.

In his artistic practice, Newman strives to highlight Indigenous, social and environmental issues as he examines the impacts of colonialism and capitalism, harnessing the power of material truth to unearth memory and trigger the necessary emotion to drive positive change. Although he works with contemporary materials and issues, he is careful to adhere to cultural values, finding ways to innovate without disregarding tradition.

Newman was selected as the master carver of the Cowichan 2008 Spirit Pole, a journey that saw him travel the province of BC sharing the experience of carving a 20-foot totem with more than 11,000 people. Chosen from a national call for the 2010 Olympic Games in Vancouver, Newman's *Dancing Wind* is installed in the Athlete's Village.

The Witness Blanket, one of his most influential pieces of work, made from objects and memories gathered from residential schools, churches, government buildings and cultural structures, and woven together in the form of a blanket, deals with the subject of Truth and Reconciliation. Newman notes that, "left alone, these pieces may be forgotten, lost, buried, or worse—be uncomfortable reminders that leave painful impressions on the minds and hearts of those who recognize what they represent. Individually, they are paragraphs of a disappearing narrative. Together, they are strong and formidable, collectively recounting for future generations the true story of loss, strength, reconciliation, and pride."

The Witness Blanket is also the subject of a companion documentary, called *Picking up the Pieces*, written and co-directed by Newman, that premiered at the 2018 Vancouver International Film Festival. In 2019, *The Witness Blanket* was placed into the collection at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights under an innovative shared stewardship agreement, which recognizes the legal rights of the blanket and the stories it carries.

Recent works include an interactive art installation in Cedar Hill Park in Saanich, BC called *Earth Drums*, which encourages people to change their relationship with the land from one of ownership to one of stewardship; the "Hearts-on Hands-on" Totem Project at Oaklands Elementary School that brought students closer to Indigenous culture through collaborative art and *All My Relations*, installed at Royal Roads University's Dogwood Auditorium, which features laser-cut stainless steel panels depicting the entire cycle of life: land, air, water and spirit world.

Newman was awarded the Extending Reconciliation award by Leadership Victoria in 2020, the Order of British Columbia in 2018 and the Government of Canada's Meritorious Service Medal in 2017. He is the Impact Chair of Indigenous Art Practices at the University of Victoria and serves on the Board of Directors for Pacific Opera Victoria, a role for which he was recognized with the 2022 National Opera Directors Award.

Royal Roads University Board of Governors

In establishing Royal Roads University through the *Royal Roads University Act* in 1995, the Province of British Columbia created a unique university with a mandate to offer applied and professional certificate, diploma and degree programs at the undergraduate and graduate levels in response to the labour market needs of British Columbia.

The government constituted Royal Roads University with unicameral governance, rather than bicameral governance. In traditional universities, a board is responsible for administrative governance and a senate is responsible for academic governance. The Royal Roads University Board of Governors carries the responsibilities of a traditional university board and senate together, and at Royal Roads, the board chair also holds the position of chancellor.
